# Dear Friends,

We're excited to share news with you as we enter the **100th year of Christmas Project** service in Hood River County. Your generous financial support and fairgrounds volunteer efforts made it a brighter Christmas for thousands in Hood River County. **Thank you, Donors & Volunteers!** Here are highlights from **Christmas Project 2022**.

# Helping Throughout The County

- Your generosity supported 3,514 people with food boxes, grocery cards, toys and gift cards for teens.
- Households at Hood River Shelter Services, Dethman House (seniors), and Helping Hands Against Violence all received food support and gifts for kids.
- 1,678 children from newborns to teens received toys or gift cards.
- Families and individuals living in Hood River, Parkdale, Cascade Locks, and Odell received much-appreciated support for Christmas.
- Volunteers delivered food boxes to people without transportation and folks who were too ill to pick up their food aid.
- A team of volunteers loaded a truck filled with children's gift bags and food boxes for more than 80 households in Cascade Locks.
- The Cascade Locks Fire Department helped deliver boxes to people in CL without transportation - thank you!

## Volunteers - We Love You!

Committee leaders and volunteers worked for many hours to bring food and JOY to more than 3,500 people over 3 very busy days.

Before distribution, more than 600 households registered online around the clock from mid-October through the end of November. A phone team called people without online access and anyone who needed extra assistance. Another inperson team visited Cascade Locks during FISH food distribution in November to sign up more.

We're grateful to the coordinators at Hood River Shelter Services, Dethman House, and Helping Hands Against Violence for working with the team to get people there registered.

#### **Food and Toys**

Our "food team" developed the menu of foods distributed to families. In 2022, we provided 2 different options, including one with more culturally-familiar foods for Hispanic community members. Clients choose whichever option they prefer, with the amount of food varying depending on family size.


The "toy team" is a lot like Santa's helpers. Armed with a budget and information about how many kids need toys, about 40 kids and parents shop at Walmart, choosing great toys for kids up to nine years old.

Older kids receive local gift cards for snacks or experiences at local businesses including Dutch Brothers Coffee, Dairy Queen, Domino's Pizza, Orchard Bowling, Joy's Art Studio, and the Park aquatic center.

#### At the Fairgrounds

Thank you to all the 200+ volunteers who came to the Fairgrounds and made Christmas Project 2022 a reality! You were the amazing people who:

- Made hundreds of boxes to hold client food
- Packed more than 700 boxes of food
- Sorted hundreds of toys into age-appropriate groups, then bagged and tagged them for pickup
- Moved thousands of pounds of food from storage warehouses to the fairgrounds
- Set up signs and distribution tables
- Carried hundreds of boxes to clients' cars and then wished them a Merry Christmas or Feliz Navidad!
- Greeted every client with a smile
- Delivered food to clients without their own transportation

In 2023, we're celebrating our **100th anniversary** by sharing our story throughout the county. We've also adopted a new logo to pay tribute to our clients, and to the warmth of the people of Hood River County who continue to care for their neighbors, at Christmas and throughout the year.
